Superintendents Report **Continuous Improvement:** Formal Negotiations will begin with Triton Teachers this week. We will seek to continue to bargain in good faith, doing everything we can to provide a positive contract for Triton Teachers. Triton will seek to get closer to the state expected \$45,000 minimum teacher salary. With the news of a 22% increase in insurance costs, it makes maximizing bargaining and teacher increases an incredibly difficult uphill battle. With that being said, we will try to continue to improve this starting teacher salary for our teachers and appreciate the respectful collaboration that has taken place thus far in pre negotiations.

Superintendents Report Continued **Accountability-** This is a reminder that this Thursday, October 9th, Triton School Corporation will hold parent teacher conferences. Elementary teachers will have a sign up for elementary parents and guardians and will assign times to keep the day moving. The Jr/Sr High School will have an open house style parent teacher conference in the TAC from 6-8pm.

Also, Triton School Corporation Scholars will have our first digital learning day of the year on Oct 9th. Practice on these expectations have been taking place over the last couple of weeks, assigned tasks will be discussed and given to students as soon as possible, they will have a window of opportunity to complete these task, and teachers will be taking attendance based on completion of these assigned tasks. Please be looking for guidance from your child's teacher or building administrator.

High Expectations- As the nine weeks comes to an end I want to thank the Triton Teachers and Coaches who continue to provide high expectations for our students and their progress. Teachers like Mrs. Orlowski who nearly each and every day keep a record of which students may need assistance in a particular subject area, then teachers respond to this by providing help to these students in their area of influence. Our coaches have pushed our athletes to be their best, some since the middle of the summer. As we approach fall state contests, our students are prepared to compete at a high level in the both conference and the upcoming state tournament. Thank you teacher, coaches, parents and community for your impact and encouragement for Trojan Scholars and Scholar Athletes.

Evidence Based Decision Making- Progress continues to be made on the implementation of Smekens corporation wide. Data meetings have been taking place at the elementary, junior high, and high school over the last few weeks. These meetings seek to evaluate the beginning of the year baselines of our students and seek to utilize this data to inform instruction. Melissa and Nate lead this charge within each building and the goal is to continue to see improvement throughout the year and various assessments dependent on which grade levels are being discussed.

Shared Leadership- This has never been more active in both buildings than it is right now. The planned shared leadership model at the elementary school has been going well. Not without pinch points and things to work through but Mrs. LaShure, Mr. McIntyre, and staff are doing a great job. Communication and clear expectations are going to need to continue to be a daily focus with teachers and areas under their influence. The shared leadership at the high school was not as planned but that too is finding its rhythm and footing. Mrs. Arvesen has owned her dual role, Mrs. Faulkner continues to lead with established initiatives, and Mr. McKeand continues to lead his staff well.

Social Responsibility- The September 26th Triton Gives Back was once again a tremendous success. Each grade level and staff member gave of their time to give back to our community and live out the social responsibility core value. Triton Alum, Trent Barnhart was on site to take an all school picture, was able to get candid and b roll for updates to our website that newly formed 2 Bar Media has taken over.
