Mr. Stichter moved to approve effective July 1, administrator and spouse contribution rate for health insurance as \$8,000/single and \$16,000/family. Continuous Improvement – A lot of projects are in the works around campus. More handicap access has been added at the baseball diamond, the pad has been poured for the band tower, both the elementary and high school office renovations are underway, ceiling tiles are being replaced in the trench, and a new cafeteria floor is in the process of being poured this week. The performing arts center will begin to be renovated the last week of June into July in preparation for the beginning of the year.

Summer School is underway. We have 75 elementary students and nearly 20 high school students taking classes to either sharpen their skills or open up room in their schedules as they work toward graduation.

Shared Leadership – The maintenance team, under the direction of new maintenance director, Barry Baker, is doing a great job on the deep clean of the buildings and assisting contractors on all of the projects that are currently going on. Our grounds looked really great for graduation and the dry weather is having Brian working hard to keep our playing surfaces well kept.
